St Helen's Archive

READ ALL ABOUT IT - NEWSPAPER ODDITIES




Good afternoon from the St Helen's Archive team. For our second article of the season, I thought we would venture into a part of the archive we have never featured before: THE NEWSPAPER ARCHIVE. Regular readers will know that for years now we have been collecting match reports from Microfilm at Swansea Library and online sources such as the British Newspaper Archive, Welsh Newspapers online and similar sources abroad. These comprise our match report data and player profile archive. Saved and backed-up as PDF files, the collection covers cricket and rugby from the earliest times and provides an enormous reservoir of information. Starting in 1785 (the first cricket matches in Swansea) this unique digital archive now comprises well in excess of two thousand articles from over 100 newspapers worldwide!

While the task of ferreting out the important match report data is a serious and exacting exercise, undertaken by a small and dedicated team, the search for an article on that elusive match often throws up unexpected articles, sometimes completely unrelated to the search but fascinating nonetheless and often hilarious. Below are some examples we have uncovered in researching early Swansea RFC matches. Such finds cheer us up even when we don't find the report we are searching for....

MATCH REPORT By: Paul Hopkins

RGC 1404 31 - 38 SWANSEA

Swansea survived a late North Walian onslaught to run out 38-31 winners in a thrilling encounter at Parc Eirias.

It was almost a perfect start for the home side when lock James Brown rose high to collect fly half Billy McBryde's kick off, but he couldn't gather possession and Swansea were able to clear.

Full back Dion Jones did well to catch a high ball, with number eight Celt Ffransis-Roberts playing the role of protector, but fly half Josh Phillips cleanly caught scrum half Tudur Jones' box kick, although he was penalised for holding on after the tackle. McBryde kicked the first points of the match.

Brown spilled the restart into touch to gift Swansea an attacking lineout, but the home side were awarded a relieving penalty.

Phillips found touch on the RGC 22 with a penalty and lock Cai Arnold took the lineout, with the pack driving forward five metres, before number eight Jacob Hopkins picked up a loose ball to score the game's opening try. Phillips converted.

A calamitous error by the home side almost let centre Delwyn Jones in for a soft try, but to the credit of the Whites' defence, the centre was held up over the line.

The visitors gave away a penalty on half way for an offside offence and McBryde chipped deep into the corner with his touch finder. Ffransis-Roberts collected the lineout and hooker Jac Petch-Jones was driven over from a rolling maul for the home side's first try. McBryde converted.

Phillips kicked deep with a penalty, and lock Ben Roberts rose high to collect the lineout, before the ball was fed out wide to full back Lewis Edwards, but the supporting winger lwan Glynn was crowded into touch just short of the line, although the ball went out off an RGC player. It mattered little though as the lineout throw was poor.

Swansea were awarded another penalty, and they were handed another 10 metres after some choice words from an RGC player. Phillips chipped to the corner and Roberts took the lineout, and although the RGC defence stayed firm at first, prop Cameron Jones used his pace to stretch over for a try. Phillips converted.

A poor pass by centre Callum Carson went into touch inside his own 22 to give RGC an attacking platform. Prop Gareth Parry powered forward, but support was slow to arrive, giving the Whites a let off. Showing some fantastic enterprise, Phillips took a quick tap penalty, and the visitors' backs made it up to the opposing 22, but a mistake brought an end to the move.

Winger Caio Parry danced past a few Swansea tacklers but was brought down on half way, and as the support was too slow, the visitors were handed a penalty, which Phillips chipped into the 22.

Arnold took the lineout, but the home pack superbly defended the maul, forcing the Whites to commit an offside infringement, so McBryde cleared up to half way.

Brown took the lineout, and Edwards failed to deal with McBryde's awkward grubber kick, and it bounced off his foot into touch on his own 22. Lock Billy McQueeney took the lineout, but his side gave away a penalty at the maul.

Caio Parry was forced to ground the ball dead after the Whites' backs cut loose, but he dealt with Edwards' grubber kick that was meant for the chasing Glynn.

Phillips took a quick lineout to Edwards, to allow centre Jack Hoskins to stretch his legs, although he was tackled. Referee Matthew Leon brought play back for a penalty and replacement hooker Osian Burt was sent to the sin-bin, leaving his side down to 13 men.

The visitors opted for an uncontested scrum on the 22 and the decision paid off as the Whites sucked in the defence and threw a pass out wide for Glynn to touch down in the corner. Phillips converted.

HALF-TIME:- RGC 1404 10-21 SWANSEA

Swansea continued where they left off after the interval with winger leuan Cornelius making a break on the wing, but his chip ahead was deflected into touch. The visitors collected the lineout with hooker Rhodri King mauling his way over for a try. Phillips converted.

Gareth Parry did well to earn a turnover and a superb pass out wide by Brown was taken by Dion Jones, but the supporting winger Louis Williams dropped the ball backwards. The home side came again through centres Gethin O'Callaghan and Delwyn Jones, before the former was bundled into touch.

Play was brought back for a penalty and prop Patrick Nelson took a regulation tap and go, before another penalty followed, which flanker Dafydd Thirsk took quickly, but opposite number Callum Bowden superbly gained a turnover. A fight then ensued with McQueeney and Carson both yellow carded.

Phillips almost broke through the middle but he was held on half way, before an outstanding 50/22 gave the visitors an attacking lineout, although Brown stole the ball.

McBryde chipped deep inside the Swansea 22 with a penalty, and Brown took the lineout, with the home side awarded a penalty, which McBryde again dinked into the corner. Thirsk took the lineout and the pack drove Burt over for a try. McBryde converted.

A superb chip ahead by Glynn forced Dion Jones to defend on his own line, and the visitors were awarded an attacking scrum five. Scrum half Matthew Aubrey tried to snipe over the line, but the supporting Hopkins powered over for a try at the next phase. Phillips converted.

The North Walian side were awarded a penalty on the RGC 22, with McBryde chipping into the corner. Ffransis-Roberts took the lineout and a clever move saw the ball swept out wide to Caio Parry for a try. McBryde converted.

Brown took a lineout on the 22, with Delwyn Jones powering forward, before flanker Ethan Fackrell nipped in for a turnover, and Phillips was able to clear long.

A misfired lineout by Burt was taken by opposite number Jamie Cox, who fed replacement prop Daf Davies, before Hoskins powered forward on the wing, but the Whites were unable to control the ball and gave away a penalty.

McBryde tried a chip ahead but the chaser was deemed in front of the kicker. Phillips chose to calm proceedings by taking a shot at goal, which he successfully converted.

But the home side collected the restart inside the Swansea 22 to set up another attack, and Delwyn Jones nipped in to score under the posts. McBryde converted.

Carson was penalised for a deliberate tap down as RGC tried to counterattack and McBryde chipped up to half way. Then replacement backs Osian Llewelyn and Sam Jones made yards on the wing, but Delwyn Jones crucially lost the ball forward.

Phillips chipped out on the full with a clearance kick to gift RGC a lineout inside the Swansea 22. Replacement lock Tal Taylor took the lineout, and the visitors gave away an offside penalty, which McBryde chipped to the corner.

Ffransis-Roberts took the lineout, but an outstanding counter maul by the visitors turned over possession. Phillips initially cleared, but Dion Jones took a quick lineout to himself to keep up the momentum. The full back then almost broke through a tackle out wide, but the supporting Thirsk dropped the ball.

In the dying seconds Carson gave away a penalty for an infringement on the ground and McBryde chipped inside the Swansea 22, but Ffransis-Roberts spilled the lineout forward.

The visitors were out on their feet at the final whistle, but thoroughly deserved their third win in a row. Next up for RGC 1404 is a trip to Aberavon, while Swansea host Carmarthen Quins.

Swansea Individual Records

On 3 occasions Swansea players have scored 20 or more points in a match. Matthew Morgan scored 24 points on 18th September 2010 (2 tries, 4 penalties and 2 conversions). Nicky J Thomas (4 tries) and Stuart Thomas (1 try, 6 conversions and 1 penalty) both scored 20 points in the same match on 29th April 2006. These three feats were all at The Park in Carmarthen.

Swansea Try Hat-Tricks

As well as Nicky J Thomas scoring four tries in one match (see above), only one other player has scored a hat-trick against the Quins.' Nicky Jones achieved this at St. Helen's, Swansea on 31st December 2005

25th October In History

There have been 23 other matches played on this day in History (W13, D2, L8). The first being in 1879 at St. Helen's, Swansea. The match ended with a Swansea victory by 3 tries & 4 goals to 1 try (39-3 in today's scoring format)

Did You Know?

This afternoon is also the 45th Anniversary of the 'Mighty All Blacks' visiting Swansea on their Northern Hemisphere day. It was a black day all round as The All Whites lost 32-0!

EXTRA TIME ...

Many of you might have seen the Legacy Number list that has highlighted every (known) player that has worn the famous 'All Whites' shirt! This took almost 5 years to compile and although I do keep the numbers updated, I can't take all the credit as I did have help from David Dow (1872-1914), Paul Hopkins (1919-1930) & Rob Phillips (1930-1945). However, there are some other statistics that I would like to share with you. By the end of the match it will already be out of date, but up until last Saturday's victory in Colwyn Bay, these are the complete statistics of Swansea RFC.....so far!!

Total Matches - 5108 Won - 3055 Drawn - 387 Lost - 1666

Swansea are just 97 points away from 80,000 in all matches and by the time we next play at home in December, that might have been surpassed.

Points Scored - 79903 Points Conceded - 51967 Tries Scored - 13720

Conversions - 6950 Penalties - 4155 DG's - 730 Goals From Mark - 37

Biggest Victories

Swansea have scored 100 points on 3 occasions. The highest scoreline was 113-7 at Penybanc in a pre-season friendly in 2010, the other 2 were in the Welsh Cup. Bala were beaten 104-3 in 2008 when the referee forgot to stop cup matches during this period before the score got to 100, the other was against Amman United in 1998. The hosts actually scored first and thought that a cup upset was on the cards. It was then one-way traffic as an international laden XV scored 100 unanswered points in a match that Shane Williams made an appearance off the bench.

Swansea Individual Records

On 140 occasions Swansea players have scored 20 or more points in a match. Rob Sweeney & Steffan Jones currently have the record with 34. Rob scored got his chance against Llanelli in the penultimate match prior to the regions forming in 2003. He started on the bench and made quite some impact scoring 3 tries, 5 conversions and 3 penalties. Steffan Jones scored 4 tries and 8 conversions against Penarth in January 1990. It was 4 points for a try in 1990, so in today's scoring system he would have amassed 38 points!

It's A Try!

Billy Trew (1897-1909) has the club record for most tries scored for Swansea. He crossed the whitewash 235 times. Dan Rees (1897-1905) scored 178, Frank Gordon (1894-1906) 171 and Arthur Emyr (1981-1989) is 4th with 161. There have been 363 try hat-tricks. The most try-hat-tricks scored by Swansea players are by Dan Rees on 21 occasions others with the most hat-ticks are Billy Trew 17 Arthur Emyr 12 and Tony Swift 10 (1979-1985). Jamie Cox has scored 3 hat-tricks this calendar year.

Record Point Scorers

Mark Wyatt is the club's record points scorer with 2913 (1977-1992), Roger Blyth (1968-1989) is next on the list with 2496, Arwel Thomas (1994-2003) scored 1974 and averaged almost 13 points a match!

Club Stalwarts

214 players are eligible to join the Swansea '100 Cap Club'. Richard Moriarty has the most appearances in a Swansea shirt with 483 (1977-1998). Swansea's favourite prop Keith Colclough is next on the list with 449 (1978-1998). Three other players have amassed over 400 matches, they are; Phil Llewellyn 433 (1966-1980), Roger Blyth 409 and DJ Thomas 400 (1900-1914).

Roy Thomas

Swansea RFC Player Legacy Number: #1730

Roy "Shunto" Thomas hailed from Penclawdd on north Gower; a club that has produced many notable players over the years including Swansea's Wales capped players Haydn Tanner, Doug Rees and Bryn Evans. "Shunto" was unfortunate not to have achieved a full Welsh cap during his playing career, having been reserve to Wales and Lions hookers Jeff Young and Bobby Windsor and holding the unenviable record of sitting on the substitute's bench no less than 26 times. Roy's sobriquet is said to have descended from his step-father: "He worked underground in the colliery, see, and he used to shunt the wagons around." Roy explained

He will be remembered in Swansea not for that unwanted statistic, but for his tough uncompromising play and his great sense of humour off the field. Additionally, "Shunto" appeared in 169 matches for Swansea's first fifteen including being in the 'All Whites' team skippered by Mike Thomas, who defeated Australia by 9 points to 8 at St Helen's on 26th November 1966. With Mike Thomas off for part of the first-half being treated for injury, Roy and the other six Swansea forwards withstood a torrid onslaught from the Wallabies until their captain's return to the field. It was a victory won by the forwards and Roy played his part.

Playing alongside the likes of Byron Mainwaring and Doug Jones, Roy completed an uncompromising Swansea front row and was a regular first team choice from 1966 to 1970. Roy also represented Swansea in their match against the 1969 touring Springboks, packing down with Alan Rutherford and David Bowen. Unfortunately the fixture was better remembered for the anti-apartheid protests and was lost 0 – 12. In 1970 he departed for Llanelli RFC appearing in 184 matches at Stradey Park until his retirement from first class rugby in 1978. This period saw "Shunto" complete his appearances against the southern hemisphere 'big three' in Llanelli's 1972 win over New Zealand, a match in which his tough play was tested and triumphed. He also was part of the Llanelli team that won four consecutive WRU Challenge Cups from 1973 to 1976.

Regarding his self-belief in his abilities and where he stood in world rugby, despite the shortage of opportunity on the international stage, Roy asserted: "You can ask anybody my age who followed rugby and I out-hooked every hooker in the world. I could get so many balls against the head because I was quick with my left foot. I was good with my lineout throwing too." And who was his toughest opponent? "No-body really. I didn't fear anyone. When I played against Bobby [Windsor], I used to out-hook him."

Roy was a regular at Swansea's Former Players' dinners and was present in 2016 at the 50th anniversary of the win over Australia. He also was presented on 28th September 2024 with his Swansea cap in acknowledgement of his having attained 100 appearances for the first fifteen.

Roy did retrospectively gain his coveted 'President's Welsh cap' for his appearance in the 44 - 8 win over Tonga on 19th September 1974 - at that time an uncapped match. He also represented West Wales and the Crawshays invitational side and later spent some time coaching Penclawdd. Roy worked delivering coal in Gower as well as transporting North Gower's famous cockles and some time spent working for British Steel. He was a great club man, determined player and thorough gentleman. Roy Thomas died in Penclawdd in October 2025.

against Llandovery.

Then going away to the Champions was another level of challenges, and we give an 80 minute performance to come away with our first win. 
